

Directive 2002/95/EC (RoHS) and 2002/96/EC (WEEE) Status

EXFO is committed to providing its worldwide customers with telecommunications test and measurement products that meet the highest standards of performance, innovation and environmental safety.

Consequently, since August 13, 2005, all of EXFO's manufactured products comply with Directive 2002/96/EC, a legislation enacted by the European Union regulating the disposal of electrical and electronic equipment (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment, or WEEE).

As for Directive 2002/95/EC (RoHS), which restricts the use of certain hazardous substances—including lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, polybrominated biphenyls (PBB) and polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE)—in electrical and electronic equipment, EXFO's instruments are classified as Category 9 items (Monitoring and Control Instruments). Products in this category are exempt from the restriction. However, it is important to EXFO to use Directive 2002/95/EC as a guideline for its product development processes.
